English

We are going to read Greek Myths and write our own. Our focus will be on organising ideas into paragraphs, developing characterisation and speech as well as using a range of conjunctions to expand and explain ideas. We are also going to read and write different forms of Poetry such as Rhyming forms, Haiku, Kenning and Free Verse.

Maths

This term we are going to focus on:

- Statistics
- Money
- Rounding and estimation
- comparing and classifying shapes
- symmetry and angles within shapes
- times tables

<u>Science</u> States of Matter

In this unit the children will consolidate their ideas about reversible changes of state. They will explore evaporation, condensation, boiling and melting. They be making observations and measurements, identifying patterns in results and suggesting explanations for observations.

RE -What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?

The children will explore how Hindus worship at home and in temples. They will investigate the symbolism of sacred objects, rituals and books. During the unit, they will make comparisons between religious and non religious practices. The unit will culminate in answering the big question.

PE -Dance

The children will focus on creating characters and narrative through movement and gesture. They will work individually, in pairs and small groups communicating ideas based on 'spies' as their stimulus.

Tag rugby

The children will learn to keep possession of the ball using attacking skills, develop strategies and social skills to self-manage games as well as learn the importance of playing fairly and keeping to the rules.

Topic

Ancient Greece

The children will learn about the time of this era and its location. They will learn about how the country was run, the role of men and women as well as comparing the lives of the city states. They will explore the question, 'Was Greece the birth-place of Western civilisation?'

Computing

- Making Music

During this unit of lessons the children will discuss and experiment with the main elements of a piece of music and will learn to compose themselves using the program Busy Beats.

<u>Music</u> <u>Glockenspiels</u>

This term we will be focusing on developing our glockenspiel skills. The children will learn to play a variety of notes and begin to read musical notation. They will develop their listening skills through a variety of games and deepen their understanding of pulse and rhythm.

DT

The children will create a moving picture book. They will investigate and evaluate moving picture books, discovering how the pictures are moved by levers and links. They will then practise making their own moving parts using different mechanisms. The children will design and make a moving picture linked to our topic of Ancient Greece.

<u>French</u>

Through games, songs and poems the children will learn and use vocabulary for food and drink. They will also improve knowledge their knowledge of French grammar, such as masculine and feminine nouns. They will build short sentences and phrases both in spoken and written language.
