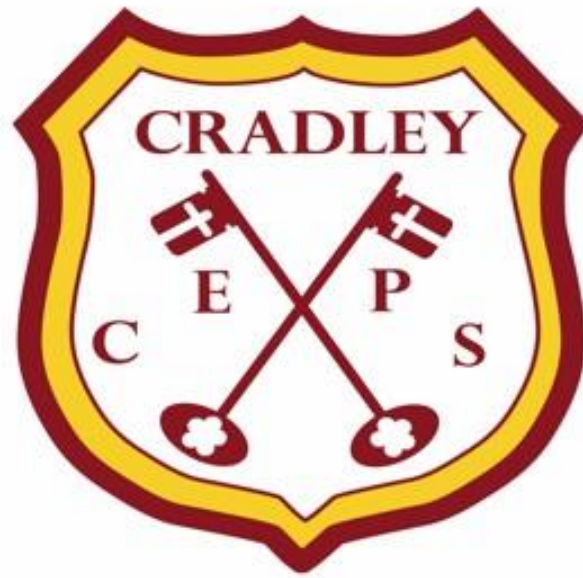


Does worship have an impact on your child?



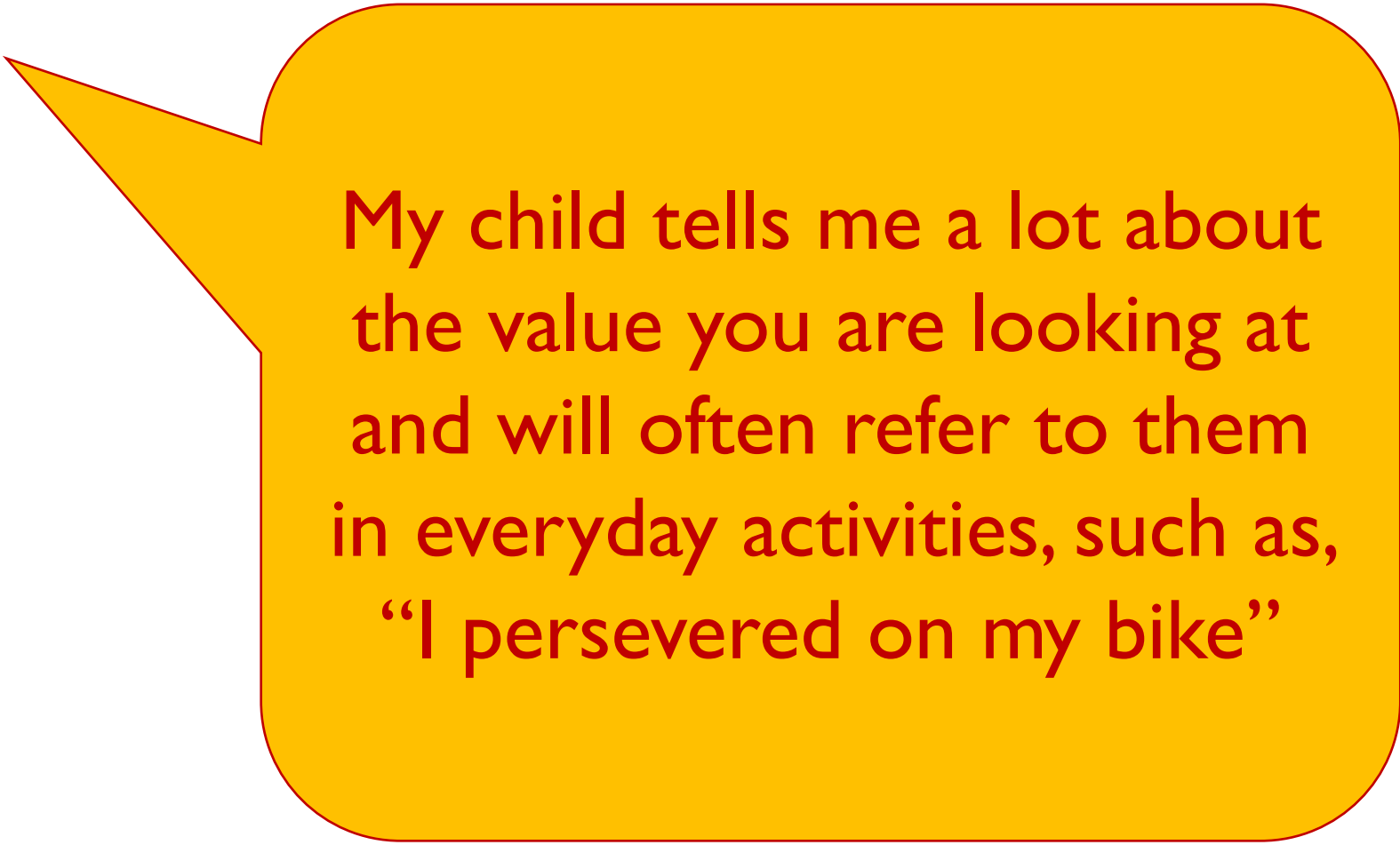

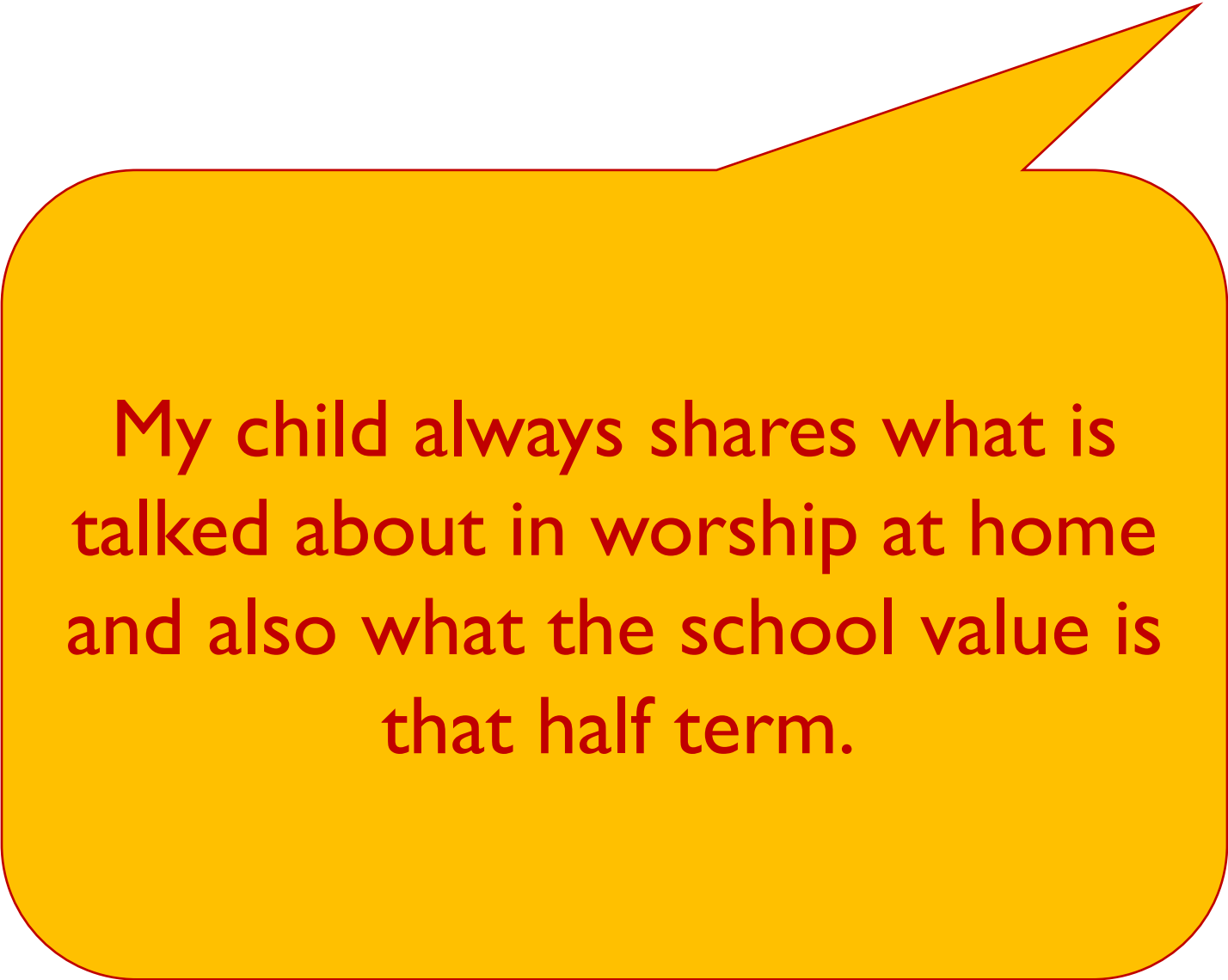

My daughter talks about values at home such as gentleness, self - control, diversity and inclusion. She understands that these help her to live better.



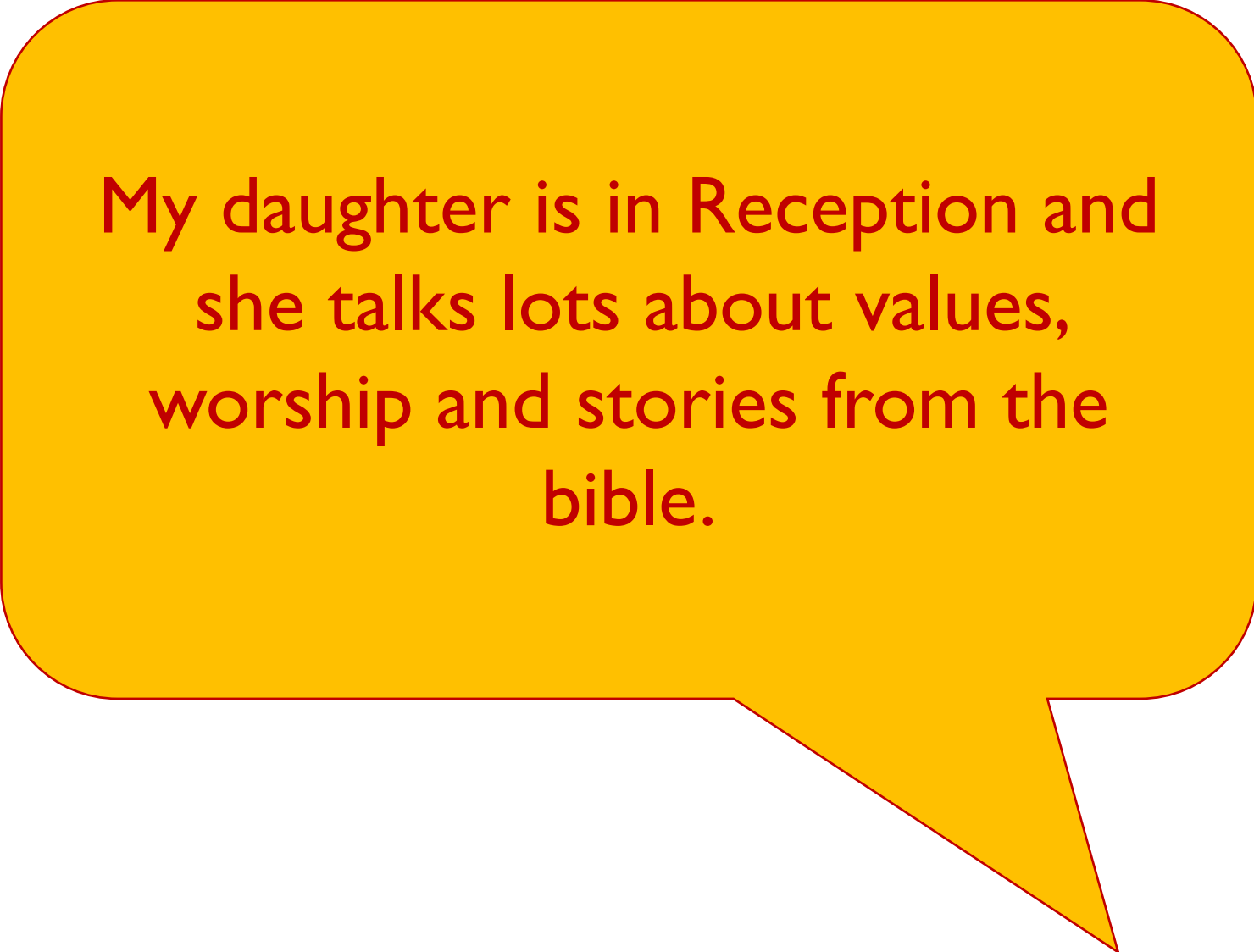
My child tells me a lot about the value you are looking at and will often refer to them in everyday activities, such as, “I persevered on my bike”

Worship has a great impact and a positive influence on my son. He finds it very interesting and engaging.



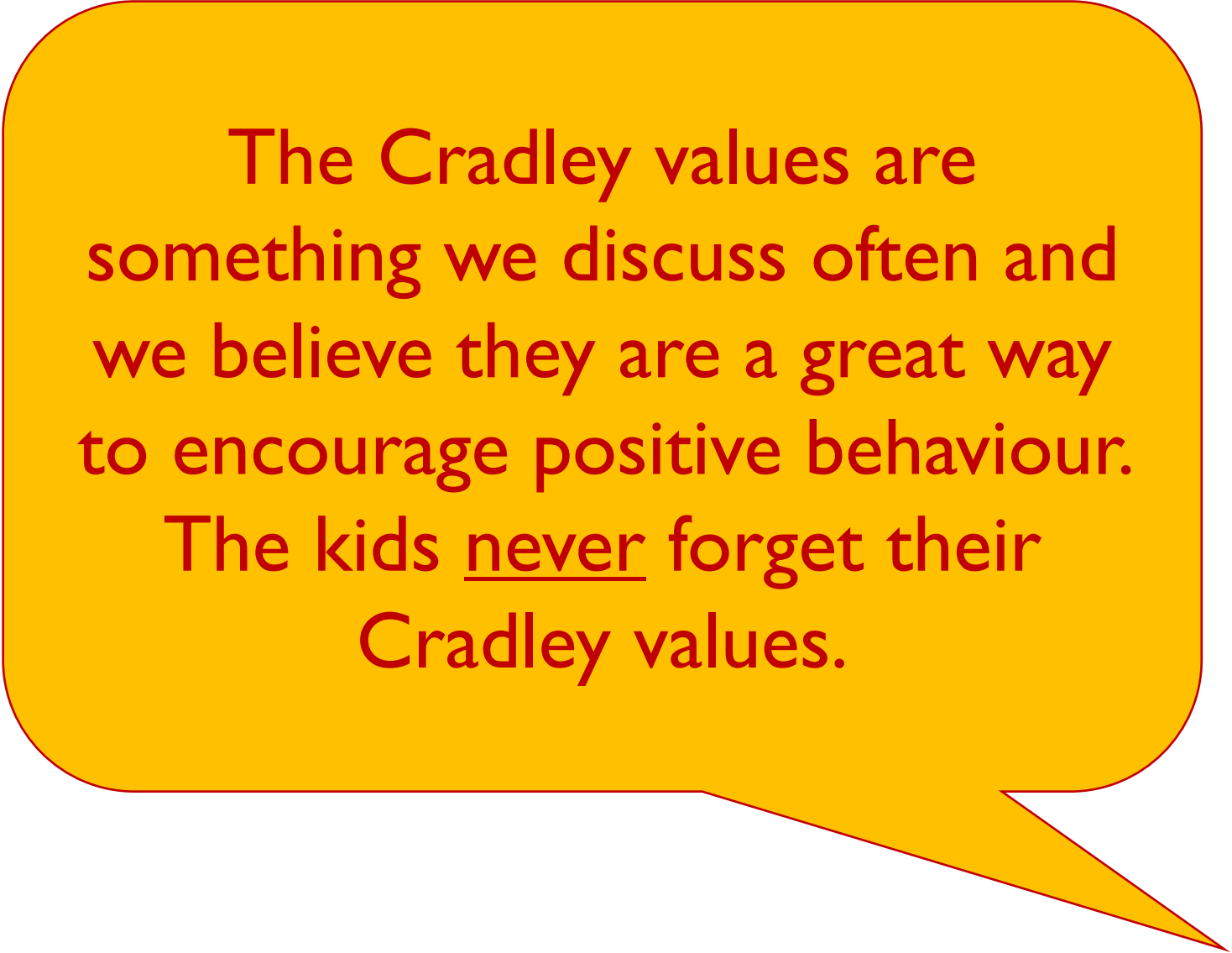
My daughter is in Reception and

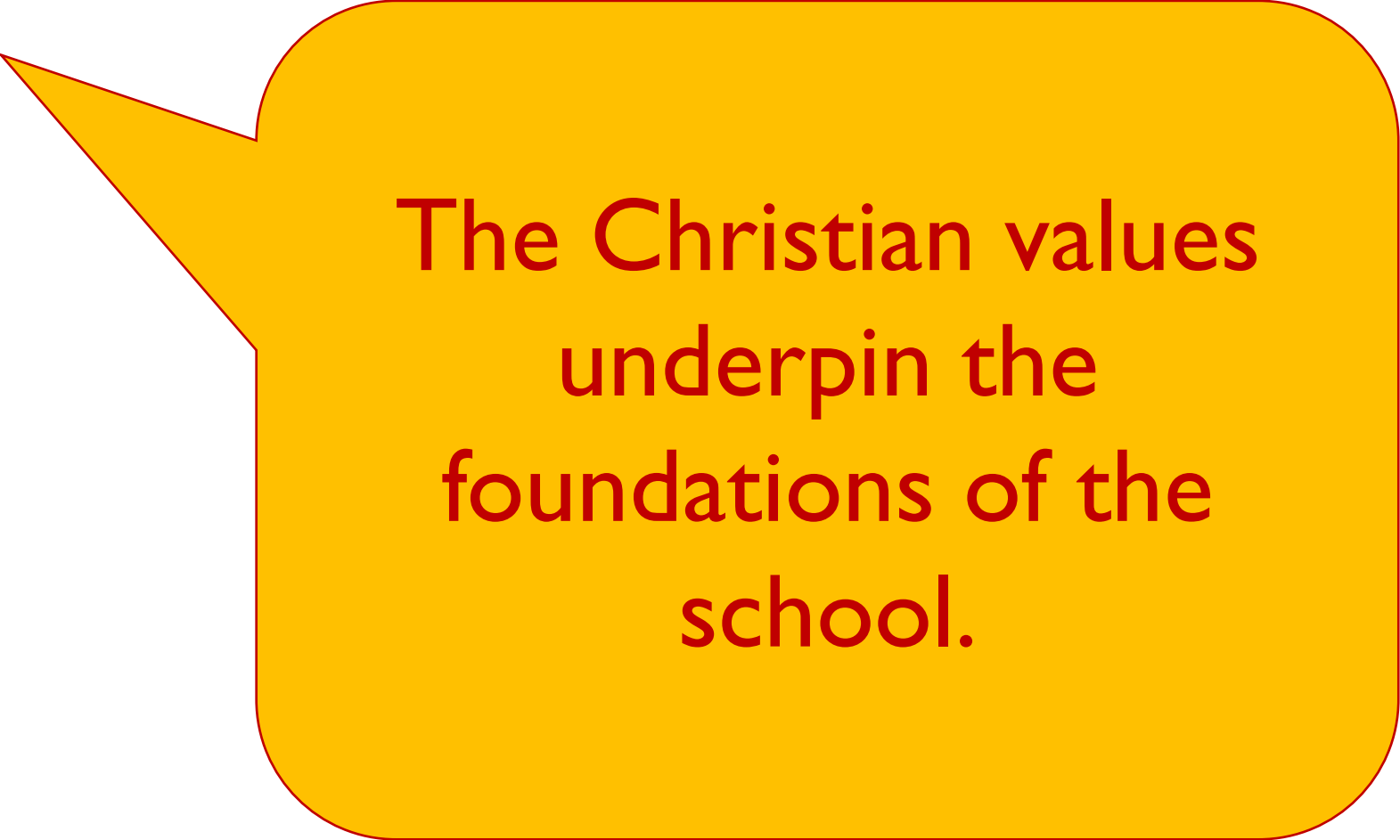

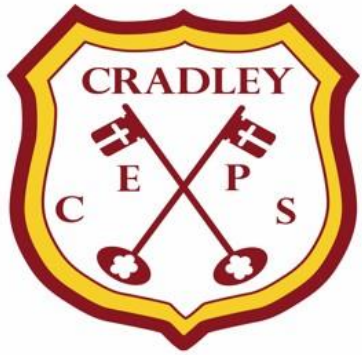
My daughter implements values learned at school in her daily living. They correspond with stories and moral and ethical values we follow at home.
