English

This half term we will be focusing on the short text 'The Game'. We will be using it to look at the structure of a 'finding story' and looking at how to add extra detail into our stories to create vivid imagery. By the end of the unit the children will create their own finding story and will experiment with changing the order of events to build tension and to really hook the reader!

Science

This half term, the children will continue to analyse and compare the life cycles of different species of animals. The children will also continue to look at how different species carry and subsequent birth their young. During the unit they will focus mainly on the life cycle of humans and how people and their bodies develop over a life time.

During this half term, we will cover these objectives and others:

Maths

- Calculating the perimeter and area of rectilinear shapes
 - Finding missing sides of shapes
 - Using negative numbers in context, including finding the difference between numbers

RE

During RE this term, the children will address the question 'how does faith help people through tough times?' This unit will focus mainly on the differing beliefs of the afterlife that religions have and how these comfort the living and those close to death. We will also look at artwork depicting the afterlife and how this portrays belief.

PE

PE this half term will be focusing on the sport of basket ball, building on the children's tactical knowledge acquired during their handball and netball units. They will also take part in an athletics unit, exposing them to a variety of sports and disciplines including running, jumping and relays using batons.

History

The children will be exploring the changing role of the monarchy over the course of English history. They will investigate how and why these changes and occurred and look and differences across the centuries. It culminates with focusing on the power our current monarch possesses.

Computing

The children will be building upon the coding knowledge that they have been acquiring across their school years. They will focus on trying to simplify and 'declutter' their coding, breaking down bigger problems into manageable 'chunks' in order to create a playable and fun game.

<u>Music</u>

This half term the children will be reviewing the learning they have acquired over the year. As a class, we will vote on our favourite song that we have looked at this year and practise this ready to perform at a musical showcase! This will include singing and instrumental interludes!

Art

The children will be focusing on the medium of still life in art this half term. They will explore the work of a variety of artists, such as Matisse and Fedden, using this knowledge to create an illusion of form in a 2D picture. They will then apply their knowledge by planning and creating their own composition.

<u>French</u>

During French, the children will be learning all about the language of weather. They will use their knowledge of French grammar to create longer sentences and extended pieces of writing. This will build up to the children creating and presenting their own Cradley weather report!
