English

This half term the children will read The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe and Information texts. They will focus on

- Extending sentences by adding clauses, such as non-finite openers and a wider range of conjunctions.
- Using linking words and phrases.

Maths

During this half term we will focus on:

- Place value and estimating numbers.
- Rounding
- Roman Numerals
- Negative numbers
- Calculating with money

Geography

Campania and Naples

The children will be studying this southern part of Italy, locating places on maps, learning about volcanoes and earthquakes, as well as investigating occupations and tourism.

RE

How and why do people try to make the world a better place?

The children will learn about religious beliefs and teachings and why people try to live and make the world a better place. They will investigate different religious organisations and how they serve communities.

PE

Rounders

The children will practise and refine their bowling, batting and fielding skills through a variety of drills and games.

Golf

The children will learn how and when to chip and putt through a variety of games.

Computing

Coding

During this unit, the children will learn how to create a written plan for a short program . They will learn to debug programs, test and correct their own programs and use an increasing range of commands.

Science

The children will learn how sound is produced and how it travels. Through investigating, they will discover how volume and pitch are altered. They will investigate how sound alters when it travels and which is the best material to absorb sound. Throughout the unit, they will practise the skills of predicting and pattern seeking.

French

The children will continue to learn how to ask for foods and will begin to express likes and dislikes regarding food . Throughout the unit, they will develop their speaking and listening skills through games and role play.
